

Information about Ulm

1. Arriving in Ulm

Ulm is in the South West of Germany and is easily accessible by plane, train, car and bus.

There are two international airports, if you arrive by plane: Munich (MUC) and Stuttgart (STR) are both nearby, but you might also consider the smaller airport of Memmingen.

Ulm can be reached best by train. International railway lines link Ulm to several other major European cities like Frankfurt, Stuttgart and Munich. Eurolines and FlixBus buses are other low-cost transport options.

2. Accommodation

3. Getting around

Trams and buses

Ulm has a good public transportation network. Buses and trams are available to take you to different parts of the city.

You can book your ticket online via <https://www.ding.eu/>. The site is only available in German, so it's best to use screenshots and translate them.

A single ticket within the city is €2,90 if you buy it in cash, online 2,75€. A single ticket allows you to use public transportation (buses and trams) for one hour - one direction. You might consider buying a day-ticket with unlimited travel options for the day (€5,50) or a week-long ticket (€26,60). If you're a group of max. 5 people a day-ticket for a group of five (€9,90) can also be an option.

Tickets can be purchased in advance via de DING app, the website, at the bus or at the bus and tram ticket machines in the city.

If you arrive by tram or bus at the Hauptbahnhof (central station), you get on the Tram Line 2 to Science Park II or the bus line 5 to Wissenschaftsstadt. You exit at the station „Kliniken Wissenschaft“. From there it's a 10 min. walk to RKU.

Cycling, walking, scooting and riding

Ulm is a bike-friendly city. The distances are doable as it won't take you more than 30 minutes to get from one side of the city to the other. TIER offers bike and electric scooter rental services.

Use the apps to find the closest bike or scooter and scan the QR code. After your journey, leave the scooter in a place where it is allowed. The RKU is included in this area as well as all parts of the city center. Note: The RKU is located on a hill, so a certain level of fitness is required.
